Nebraska completes non-conference play on Saturday night when the Huskers take on the Northern Iowa Panthers at Memorial Stadium. The first meeting between the schools is set to kick off shortly after 6:30 p.m. BTN will provide the national television coverage and the game can be heard on the Huskers Radio Network and Huskers App.

The Huskers come into the contest at 2-0 after a 28-10 victory over Colorado in an electric environment in Memorial Stadium last Saturday. Nebraska jumped to a 28-0 halftime lead behind a dominant defensive effort and cruised to the win to improve to 2-0 for the first time since 2016. The win also vaulted Nebraska into the national polls at No. 23 in the AP poll and No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches poll.

Through two games, the Huskers have shown the ability to control the clock with a balanced offensive attack. Nebraska is averaging 186.0 yards per game on the ground, while throwing for 234.5 yards per game. The Blackshirt defense has limited opponents to just 36.0 rushing yards through two contests, while holding both opponents to 10 points or less. The Huskers have also won the turnover margin through two games, committing just one turnover in two contests, while forcing two takeaways against both UTEP and Colorado.

Northern Iowa also enters Saturday's game with a 2-0 record after a 17-10 victory at St. Thomas (Minn.) on Saturday. UNI trailed 10-7 entering the fourth quarter but scored 10 points in the final quarter, including the game-winning touchdown with 2:47 remaining. The Panthers opened the season with a win over Valparaiso on Aug. 31. UNI has controlled the line of scrimmage through two games, averaging 298.5 rushing yards per game, while allowing just 79.0 rushing yards per contest. The Panthers are ranked No. 21 in this week's FCS coaches poll.

A win on Saturday over UNI would give Nebraska a perfect 3-0 record in non-conference play. Nebraska last went undefeated in non-league action in 2016, and since 2000 also posted perfect non-conference records in 2000, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2010, 2011 and 2014.

The Nebraska defense has held the opposition to 14 or fewer points in six consecutive home games, including 2024 wins over UTEP and Colorado. Under Matt Rhule, Nebraska has held eight of nine opponents at Memorial Stadium to 14 or fewer points.

#### **HUSKERS TO TAKE ON FCS FOE IN PANTHERS**

Saturday's game is the first all-time meeting between Nebraska and Northern Iowa. It will mark Nebraska's 15th game all-time against an FCS foe (at time of game), with the Huskers holding a 14-0 record in those contests.

- In 2022, Nebraska defeated North Dakota, 38-17, in its most recent matchup with an FCS foe.
- All of Nebraska's games against FCS opponents have occurred since 1992, including facing an FCS opponent for five straight seasons from 2010 to 2014.
- Northern Iowa is a member of the Missouri Valley Football Conference. The Huskers are 19-1-2 all-time against current members of the MVFC, including 2-0 vs. North Dakota, 14-1-2 vs. South Dakota and 3-0 vs. South Dakota State. The majority of those games occurred before those schools moved to the FCS ranks.

#### **HUSKERS SET TO SHINE UNDER THE LIGHTS**

Nebraska's matchup with Northern Iowa is the second of three consecutive prime-time home games at Memorial Stadium. Nebraska hosted Colorado last week in a prime-time game, plays UNI this Saturday and will host Illinois on Friday, Sept. 20, in a night game in Lincoln.

- This marks just the third time in school history the Huskers have played three straight home night games. Nebraska also hosted three consecutive prime-time games in 2008 (New Mexico State, Virginia Tech, Missouri) and 2002 (Arizona State, Troy, Utah State).
- Nebraska has a strong history of success in night games in Lincoln. The Huskers are 51-10 in home night games at Memorial Stadium following last week's 28-10 victory over Colorado.

#### **HUSKERS RETURN TO NATIONAL POLLS**

Nebraska is 2-0 following victories over Colorado and UTEP and the fast start has vaulted the Huskers back into the national polls. NU is ranked 23rd in this week's Associated Press Poll and 24th in the USA Today Coaches poll.

- The national ranking is Nebraska's first since 2019. The Huskers were ranked No. 25 in both polls after the season opener, but lost the following week at Colorado.
- The last time Nebraska was ranked higher than this week's No. 23 AP ranking was in 2016, when Nebraska was ranked 17th entering the regular-season finale at lowa.

#### **NEBRASKA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME TO INDUCT 2024 CLASS**

Nebraska will honor the 2024 Nebraska Football Hall of Fame Class with an on-field recognition before Saturday's game. Seven Husker football standouts and a state college All-American comprise the 2024 class of the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame, which will be officially inducted in a reception on Friday night at Memorial Stadium.

The seven former Huskers include defensive lineman **Monte Johnson** (Legends category) offensive lineman **Keven Lightner** (1980s category), safety **Tyrone Byrd** (1990s), linebacker **Terrell Farley** (1990s), defensive end **Chris Kelsay** (2000-07 era), defensive tackle **Jared Crick** (2008-14 era) and running back **Rex Burkhead** (2008-14 era). The state college representative in the 2024 class is Mike Miller, an All-America running back at Nebraska-Kearney in the early 2000s.

To be eligible players must have been either an All-American or first (before 1996) or second-team (after 1996) all-conference selection to make the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame ballot.

#### **BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE OFF TO STRONG 2024 START**

The Nebraska defense was one of the nation's most improved units in 2023. The Blackshirts have opened the 2024 season with strong showings in victories over UTEP and Colorado. Nebraska has allowed just 17 combined points through two games, the fewest through two games since NU allowed 12 points in the first two games in 2009. The Blackshirts have also racked up eight sacks and limited the opposition to 36.0 rushing yards per game.

- Nebraska held UTEP to seven points and Colorado to 10 second-half points. Nebraska has now
  held nine straight opponents to 24 or fewer points. This is the longest stretch Nebraska has
  limited the opposition to 24 points or less since a 14-game stretch spanning the 2009 and 2010
  seasons.
- Nebraska has been even more stingy at home. The Huskers have held each of their past six opponents at Memorial Stadium to 14 or fewer points. In fact, since the start of the 2023 season, just one of nine opponents at Memorial Stadium have scored more than 14 points.

#### **NOTING LAST WEEK'S GAME**

- The Huskers' 18-point victory marked their largest against Colorado since a 45-17 victory in 2010.
- Nebraska limited Colorado to 16 rushing yards. Colorado's 16 rushing yards are the fewest by a Nebraska opponent since Purdue was held to -2 rushing yards in 2020.
- Nebraska recorded six sacks, including four before halftime. The Huskers sacked Colorado eight times for 65 yards in last year's game.
- Nebraska has held each of its past six opponents at Memorial Stadium to 14 or fewer points.
- Cornerback Tommi Hill intercepted a CU pass and returned it seven yards for a TD. It was Hill's fifth career interception, and his first interception return for a touchdown.
- Hill's pick-six was the first for Nebraska since Cam Taylor-Britt had a 38-yard interception return for a touchdown against lowa in 2019.
- Senior running back Rahmir Johnson caught an 18-yard TD pass to close the first half scoring. The TD reception was Johnson's third career receiving TD and first since 2021. Johnson finished with a careerhigh eight catches.
- Nebraska blocked a second-quarter Colorado field goal. It marked Nebraska's fifth blocked kick in the past two seasons, including four field goals and one punt.

- The Huskers have held both UTEP (205 total yards) and Colorado (260 total yards) to less than 300 total yards. Dating back to last season, Nebraska has held nine straight opponents to less than 400 total yards. The last time Nebraska had held nine straight opponents to less than 400 yards was part of a 14-game stretch spanning the final three games of 2008 and first 11 contests of 2009.
- Nebraska held Colorado to just 16 rushing yards on 22 attempts, the fewest rushing yards by an opponent since Purdue had -2 rushing yards in 2020. NU opened the season by allowing just 56 rushing yards against UTEP. In 14 games under Head Coach Matt Rhule, the Huskers have held the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards 10 times, including seven games with 75 yards or less.

# **DEFENSE PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD**

While limiting the opposition to just 17 points through two games, the Husker defense has also scored on its own. In the season opener against UTEP, Nebraska recorded a safety and followed up with a pick-six by **Tommi Hill** against Colorado.

- The interception for a touchdown by Hill against the Buffs was Nebraska's first pick-six since Cam Taylor-Britt had a 38-yard interception for a touchdown against lowa in 2019. It was Nebraska's first defensive touchdown of any kind since Deontai Williams returned a fumble for a score against Penn State in 2020.
- In the 40-7 win over UTEP in the opener, defensive lineman Ty Robinson had a tackle for loss for a safety. It was Nebraska's first defensive safety since 2015.
- With scores in both games, it marks the first time the Husker defense has scored in consecutive games since 2015, when Joshua Kalu had an interception return for a touchdown at Minnesota, and a week later the Huskers had a safety against Northwestern in Lincoln.

# WINNING THE TURNOVER MARGIN

Nebraska's defense has posted multiple takeaways in each of the first two games, gaining a pair of turnovers against both UTEP and Colorado. In turn, the Nebraska offense has just one turnover in two games, giving Nebraska a +3 turnover margin. Last year, Nebraska posted a -17 turnover margin.

- The multiple takeaways in consecutive games marks the first time the Husker defense has accomplished that since 2020 when Nebraska had multiple takeaways against Northwestern and Penn State.
- This is the first time Nebraska has had a positive turnover margin in consecutive games since the final two games of the 2022 season when the Huskers had a +1 (Wisconsin) and +3 (Iowa) turnover margin in consecutive games.

#### NEBRASKA SHOWING BALANCED OFFENSIVE ATTACK

The Nebraska offense has been balanced and efficient through two games. In the seasonopening victory over UTEP, Nebraska posted its most explosive effort in the past two seasons, the the Huskers backed that up with three first-half offensive touchdowns in a 28-10 win over Colorado.

- Nebraska's 40 points against UTEP were its most since scoring 42 against Georgia Southern in 2022, and the 33-point margin of victory was Nebraska's largest since a 56-7 victory over Northwestern in 2021. It was the Huskers' largest margin of victory in a season opener since a 43-10 win over Fresno State to open the 2016 season.
- The Huskers gained 507 yards of total offense against the Miners, the most by Nebraska since gaining 575 yards against Georgia Southern in 2022. The Huskers reached 339 yards before halftime, which was just 80 yards shy of last year's season high for total offense for a full game (419 vs. Louisiana Tech).
- Nebraska's 284 passing yards were its most since throwing for 354 yards at Purdue in 2022.
   Nebraska's season high in passing yards in 2023 was 199 vs. Michigan.
- Nebraska added 223 rushing yards with 11 players having at least one carry. The win over UTEP marked the first time Nebraska topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since 2022 against Georgia Southern.
- The Huskers were once again balanced on offense against Colorado, rushing 35 times for 149 yards, while completing 23-of-30 passes for 185 yards.
- The first two games have showcased Nebraska's many offensive weapons. Twelve players have carried the ball through two games, while 14 Huskers have caught a pass. In the opener, Nebraska had 11 ball carriers and 11 receivers, the most in both categories in a single game since 2021.
- Nebraska has controlled the football in the first two games, averaging 36:57 in time of possession to rank first in the Big Ten and fifth nationally.



#### **RAIOLA EFFICIENTLY GUIDING HUSKER OFFENSE**

True freshman quarterback **Dylan Raiola** has been impressive in leading Nebraska to a 2-0 start. In the season opener, Raiola completed 19-of-27 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns, while playing just one series after halftime. Raiola became just the second true freshman Husker quarterback since World War II to start a season opener, joining Adrian Martinez in 2018. Raiola earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his play in the opener. He backed that up by completing 23-of-30 passes for 185 yards and a touchdown in the win over Colorado.

- Raiola is the first Husker freshman (redshirt or true) quarterback to win his first start since Taylor Martinez guided Nebraska to a victory over Western Kentucky in the 2010 season opener. Martinez won his first five starts of the 2010 season.
- The 232 yards of total offense by Raiola against UTEP compared favorably to other Husker freshman quarterbacks over the past three decades making their starting debuts.

#### VETERAN RECEIVERS MAKE QUICK IMPACT

Nebraska added a pair of veteran receivers through the transfer portal in the offseason. **Jahmal Banks** joined the Huskers from Wake Forest, while **Isaiah Neyor** came to Nebraska after previously playing at Texas and Wyoming. The two seniors each check in at 6-4 and 220 pounds, and have shown an immediate connection with quarterback Dylan Raiola.

- Neyor posted his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and first since 2021 with six receptions
  for 121 yards and a 59-yard touchdown against UTEP. Neyor's six catches matched his career high
  and his 121 yards were just five yards shy of a career high. Five of Neyor's receptions came before
  halftime. He added four catches for 31 yards against Colorado.
- Banks also made his mark in the opener with four catches for 61 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown catch just two seconds before halftime. He had a pair of catches against Colorado.
- Both players have had productive collegiate careers before joining the Huskers. Banks now has 113
  career catches for 1,467 yards and 14 career touchdowns. Neyor has 63 catches for 1,292 yards
  and 13 touchdowns in his career. Neyor averages an impressive 20.5 yards per catch in his career.

## **HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE**

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team is the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen have combined to play in 224 career games with 153 career starts entering this season.

- According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 163 combined offensive line starts ranks as the fifth most in the country.
- Bryce Benhart, a member of the Outland Trophy watch list, leads the way with 43 career starts, starting 43 of Nebraska's 46 games at right tackle the past four seasons. Benhart's 43 career starts are the most starts by an offensive lineman in program history.
- Turner Corcoran has started 33 games for the Huskers with 28 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games before suffering a season-ending injury against Northwestern last season.
- Ben Scott is in his second season as Nebraska's starting center. A member of the Rimington
  Trophy watch list, Scott started 11 games for the Huskers last season, and he has made 41 career
  starts including his three seasons at Arizona State.
- Bolstering the line is the addition of transfer **Micah Mazzccua**. Mazzccua has started 23 games in his career, including 11 starts at right guard for Florida in 2023 and 10 starts at Baylor in 2022.
- Teddy Prochazka has started 11 games for Nebraska, but he will miss the 2024 campaign after suffering an injury during fall camp. The injury marked the third time in four seasons that Prochazka has suffered a season-ending injury.
- Justin Evans (7 starts), Henry Lutovsky (4 starts) and Joey Mancino (1 start) have also started at least one game on the Nebraska offensive line.

#### TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

Nebraska added 60 newcomers to its roster in 2024. That number includes a large freshman class of 48, but adding experience to the roster are 12 first-year transfers, including six FBS transfers.

- The group of six FBS transfers all came from Power Conference programs. The six players have combined for 172 games played and 87 starts in their careers.
- Stefon Thompson played in 36 games with 21 starts at linebacker for Syracuse. He entered the 2024 season with 169 career tackles, 20.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks. Thompson owns the most tackles, TFLs and sacks of any Husker on the 2024 roster.
- Micah Mazzccua started 21 games on the offensive lines at Baylor and Florida. In 2022 at Baylor, PFF ranked Mazzccua as the best run-blocker in the Big 12 and the nation's 15th-best run blocker.
- Ceyair Wright made 15 starts at cornerback for USC in 2022 and 2023. He totaled 41 tackles as a Trojan with 1.0 tackle for loss, one interception and five pass breakups.
- Isaiah Neyor has started 15 games in his career. He was a second-team All-Mountain West Conference selection in 2021 at Wyoming before spending two seasons at Texas. Neyor has caught 63 passes for 1,292 yards and 13 touchdowns in his career. Neyor ranks second to fellow first-year transfer Jahmal Banks in career receptions, yards and touchdowns among Huskers.
- Jahmal Banks played in 43 games with 11 starts at Wake Forest before transferring to Nebraska. Banks totaled 107 receptions for 1,404 yards and 13 touchdowns as a Demon Deacon. He owns the most career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns of any current Husker.
- Dante Dowdell spent one season at Oregon before transferring to Nebraska. Dowdell had 17 carries for 90 yards and one touchdown in 2023 for a Duck team that ranked second nationally in total offense and scoring offense. Dowdell leads Nebraska with 129 rushing yards through two games, including a career-high 74 yards against Colorado.

#### NINE HUSKERS EARN SPOTS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Nine Nebraska Cornhuskers made a preseason watch list for a major national award this summer.

- True freshman **Jacory Barney Jr.** was named to the watch list for The Jet Award, presented to the nation's top returner. The award is named after Husker Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers.
- Bryce Benhart was one of 75 linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. Benhart was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection as Nebraska's starting right tackle in 2023. The Outland Trophy is presented annually to the nation's best interior lineman.
- Brian Buschini, the 2021 FCS Punter of the Year, was one of 33 punters named to the preseason watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best punter.
- Thomas Fidone II was one of 48 tight ends named to the preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award, presented annually to the nation's best tight end. Fidone led Nebraska with four touchdown catches in 2024, the most by a Husker tight end since 2010.
- Isaac Gifford was honored for his work on the field and in the community with an appointment to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Gifford led Nebraska with 86 tackles while earning honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades. Off the field, he earned a Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024 and was named to both the Brook Berringer and Tom Osborne Citizenship teams.
- Nash Hutmacher was one of 90 players and 37 defensive linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Hutmacher was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection last season.
- Dylan Raiola was named to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list and the Shaun Alexander Award Watch list.
- Isaiah Neyor was one of 93 players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list. The award is presented to the top offensive player who played high school or college football in Texas.
- Ben Scott, an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection in 2023, was one of 40 centers named to the Rimington Trophy watch list. The Rimington Trophy - named after former Husker center Dave Rimington - is presented annually to the nation's top center.



#### RHULE LOOKS FOR ANOTHER STRONG SECOND SEASON

Nebraska went 5-7 in Matt Rhule's first season. The Huskers aim to increase their win total this season, something Rhule has done at each of his previous two collegiate head coaching stops.

- In his first head coaching job at Temple, Rhule helped the Owls to a four-win improvement from his first season to his second. Then at Baylor, Rhule guided the Bears to a six-win improvement from year one to year two. That improvement ranked third nationally and was the largest win improvement of any Power Conference program that season.
- Rhule took on rebuilding jobs at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, which contributed to an 8-28 combined record in his first season at each school. But excluding his first season at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, Rhule boasts a 44-22 record with three 10-win seasons in five years.
- Rhule has a proven record as a program builder. He led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the school's first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach at a Power Conference school to take a team from 11 losses (1-11 in 2017) to 11 victories (11-3 in 2019) in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.

#### **MAJORITY OF STAFF RETURNS & RULE CHANGE BOLSTERS STAFF**

The Huskers return eight of their 10 full-time assistants from last season, welcoming two new full-time assistants to the coaching staff. In addition to the two new assistants, an NCAA rule change has permitted additional staff members to provide on-field coaching.

- **Donovan Raiola** is in his third season at Nebraska in 2024 after being the lone assistant coach retained by Matt Rhule following the 2022 season.
- Other returning coaches on the offensive staff include offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield (second season), running backs coach E.J. Barthel (second season) and wide receivers coach Garret McGuire (second season). The four returning offensive assistants helped the Huskers rank second in the Big Ten in rushing last season.
- **Glenn Thomas** is the lone new addition to the offensive staff, serving as Nebraska's quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator. He came to Lincoln after one season as an offensive assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, helping the Steelers to a berth in the AFC playoffs in 2023.
- Thomas spent five seasons on Matt Rhule's coaching staffs at Temple and Baylor, serving as the offensive coordinator for the Owls in 2016 and as the co-offensive coordinator at Baylor from 2017 to 2019. Thomas also has recent experience as a quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at Arizona State (2022) and UNLV (2020-21).
- On defense, coordinator Tony White (second season) returns as does linebackers coach Rob Dvoracek (second season) and defensive line coach Terrance Knighton (second season). Last year, that trio helped Nebraska post its best scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- John Butler is the only new defensive assistant, serving as the Huskers' secondary coach and pass game coordinator. Butler came to Nebraska after spending the previous six seasons as the defensive backs coach for the Buffalo Bills. Buffalo had a top-five pass defense rating in five of his six seasons, helping the Bills win four AFC North titles and make five playoff appearances.
- Special teams coordinator **Ed Foley** also returns for his second season in 2024. He helped Nebraska rank third nationally in blocked kicks in his first season last fall.
- With the removal of the NCAA rule limiting the number of on-field coaches, Matt Rhule has announced 10 more staff members who will provide additional on-field coaching this fall.

#### NINE HUSKERS NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

A total of nine Huskers made the preseason watch list for the Reese's Senior Bowl. The Reese's Senior Bowl is widely regarded as the preeminent college football all-star game and the first stage in the NFL Draft process. The 2025 game will be played on Feb. 1 in Mobile, Ala.

- Five offensive players made the Senior Bowl watch list: wide receivers Jahmal Banks and Isaiah Neyor, tight end Thomas Fidone II and offensive linemen Micah Mazzccua and Ben Scott.
- Four defenders also made the Senior Bowl watch list: defensive linemen Nash Hutmacher and Ty Robinson and defensive backs Tommi Hill and DeShon Singleton.

#### SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

For the second straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

• The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said prior to the 2023 season. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

#### **NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2023 SEASON**

Nebraska entered 2024 with a goal of making significant progress in Matt Rhule's second season. Despite finishing 5-7 in 2023, Nebraska made strides in many areas. Four of the seven losses were by three points with a fifth loss by a touchdown in overtime. Due to injuries, Nebraska used three different starting quarterbacks in its five one-score losses.

- Nebraska had the program's fewest penalty yards per game (42.8) since 1998.
- The Huskers ranked among the nation's 15 most-improved teams in rushing offense, rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense. NU had the nation's No. 2 most-improved rush defense, the No. 3 most-improved total defense and the No. 10 most-improved scoring defense. Offensively, the Huskers had the 14th most-improved rushing attack from 2022 to 2023.
- Nebraska posted its best statistical rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense since joining the Big Ten in 2011. The Huskers allowed their fewest points per game (18.3) since 2010, their fewest yards per game (303.5) since 2009 and their fewest rushing yards per game (92.9) since 1999
- NU ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense, 11th nationally in total defense and 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2023. The Huskers posted their highest national ranking in rushing defense since 1999 and best national ranking in total and scoring defense since 2010.
- Nebraska held eight opponents to 14 or fewer points in 2023, a first for the program since the 2009 season, when the Huskers led the nation in scoring defense.
- The Huskers held six of their 12 opponents in 2023 to fewer than 300 total yards, while also limiting eight of 12 opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards.
- Nebraska totaled its most sacks (32) since 2014 and most tackles for loss (76) since 2016.
- Offensively, the Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten in rushing in 2023 (176.8 ypg).
- Nebraska also had one of the best big-play offenses in the Big Ten. The Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten with eight plays of 50 yards or longer in 2023 while leading the league in rushes of 40 yards or longer, 60 yards or longer and 70 yards or longer.
- From a special teams standpoint, Nebraska ranked third nationally with four blocked kicks in 2023. The Huskers recorded their most blocked kicks since 2014.

#### A LOOK AT NEBRASKA'S 2024 SCHEDULE

Nebraska completes non-league play this week, before moving on to nine Big Ten contests, including games against UCLA and USC, each of whom are in their first season as a Big Ten member. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.

- Nebraska will play Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin.
   The Huskers will not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska opened the 2024 season at home against UTEP, marking the first season since 2019 that Nebraska played its first game of the season at home. It was also the first time since 2019 that the Huskers have opened the season against a non-conference opponent.
- The Huskers played their opener in August for the fourth straight season and for the fifth time in the past five full seasons (2020 excluded).
- Nebraska plays each of its first four games at home. The four straight home games to open the season marks the Huskers' longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- The Huskers will play their second of three consecutive home night games on Saturday. This will be only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008) Nebraska has had three straight night home games.
- The Big Ten opener is against Illinois on Friday, Sept. 20 at Memorial Stadium. That contest will mark Nebraska's NCAA-record 400th consecutive sellout while also being the Huskers' first weekday home game since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

# **NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS**

Nebraska is playing its 135th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 919 wins and 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.



# **HOME OF THE HUSKERS**



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

# 2024 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

#### SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska's schedule consists of three nonconference games to open the season followed by nine Big Ten contests. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.
- Nebraska will play Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin. The Huskers will not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska will play its first four games at home, markings the longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- The Huskers are playing three consecutive home night games for only the third time in program history (also 2002 and 2008).
- The Big Ten opener against Illinois on Friday, Sept. 20 will mark the 400th sellout at Memorial Stadium. The game will also mark the first Friday night home game in school history while being the first weekday home game (excluding Black Friday) since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.

#### **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

- Matt Rhule is in his second season at Nebraska in 2024. Rhule is in his 12th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 54-50 in his eight seasons as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a step forward in his second season at each school. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's second season in 2014 and Baylor improved by six wins in his second season in 2018, an improvement that led all power conference teams and ranked third in the FBS.
- Rhule then guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Eight Husker assistants return from last season: Marcus Satterfield (offensive coordinator/tight ends), Tony White (defensive coordinator), Ed Foley (special teams coordinator), E.J. Barthel (running backs), Rob Dvoracek (linebackers), Terrance Knighton (defensive line), Garret McGuire (wide receivers) and Donovan Raiola (offensive line).
- John Butler (secondary/pass game coordinator) and Glenn Thomas (co-offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks) are in their first season at NU.

- The roster features 91 returning players and 60 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 20 starters and 39 letterwinners.
- Nebraska has added 12 transfers and 48 true freshmen to its roster in 2024. Among the 12 transfers are six FBS transfers, three junior college players, two FCS transfers and one NAIA transfer.
- All six of Nebraska's FBS transfers came from Power Conference programs (Florida, Oregon, Syracuse, Texas, USC and Wake Forest).
- The roster features players from 29 states and one foreign country (Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2024 roster include: Nebraska (53), Texas (12), Iowa (8), Florida (7), Pennsylvania (7), California (6), New Jersey (5), Arizona (4), Colorado (4), Georgia (4), Illinois (3), Louisiana (3), Maryland (3), Minnesota (3), Missouri (3), New York (3), Tennessee (3), Hawaii (2), Kansas (2), Michigan (2), Mississippi (2), Montana (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Alabama, North Carolina, Nevada, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2024 roster.
- The players who are wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote.

# SCOUTING THE UNI PANTHERS



Northern Iowa opened the 2024 season with victories against Valparaiso and St. Thomas to move the Panthers to 2-0. UNI is ranked No. 21 in this week's FCS Coaches poll.

The Panthers are averaging 26 points and 406 yards per game, with 107.5 yards per game through the air and 298.5 yards per game on the ground. Aidan Dunne has completed 23-of-42 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns. Sergio Morancy leads the Panthers with five receptions for 57 yards and a touchdown. Layne Pryor has added five grabs for 51 yards and a score.

Defensively, the Panthers are allowing 8.5 points and 217 yards per game this season. Jonathan Cabral-Martin leads the UNI defense with a team-high 20 tackles, followed by Ben Belken with 15 stops. Tucker Langenberg has a team-high three tackles for loss, while Zach Mehmert leads the Panthers with 1.5 sacks through two games.

Mark Farley is in his 24th season as the head coach at Northern Iowa.

Farley is the winningest coach in UNI and Missouri Valley Football Conference history with 182 wins, including 17 playoff victories.

Farley has led the Panthers to a mark of 182-103 in his 24 years at the helm of the program, second-most all-time among all active FCS coaches. In MVFC play, he has guided the Panthers to a record of 116-59 for an impressive .663 winning percentage. Farley is the MVFC's all-time coaching wins leader.

Under the helm of Coach Farley, the Panthers have won at least a share of seven MVFC titles. UNI has had 13 playoff appearances, advancing to the quarterfinals (2003, 2007, 2011, 2015, 2019), semifinals (2001, 2008) and the national title game (2005). Farley's teams have finished in the top-25 final rankings 16 times. The Panthers defeated 92 top-25-ranked foes under Farley

Saturday night's matchup is the first all-time meeting for Farley against the Huskers.

## **NORTHERN IOWA INFORMATION**

Northern Iowa has fielded a football team since 1895, and the Panthers have tallied nearly 700 wins as a program. UNI has claimed 33 conference titles, with two Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships, 12 North Central Conference titles, three Association of Mid-Continent Universities championships and 16 Missouri Valley Conference championships.



Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Before taking the Nebrasksa job, Rhule one won conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins in a five-season span (2015-19).

#### TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016.
   He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

#### AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.
