Nebraska continues a difficult two-game road trip, taking on a second straight ranked opponent away from Lincoln on Saturday. The Huskers will travel to Columbus, Ohio, to take on Ohio State, with game time at Ohio Stadium set for 11 a.m. CT (Noon ET). FOX will provide the television coverage of the contest, and Saturday's game can also be heard on the Huskers Radio Network and the Huskers App.

The Huskers stand at 5-2 on the season and 2-2 in Big Ten play following a 56-7 loss at No. 16 Indiana on Saturday afternoon. Nebraska cut the Indiana lead to 14-7 midway through the second quarter of Saturday's game, however two touchdowns in the final four minutes of the first half gave Indiana full control. The Hoosiers did not look back in the second half en route to the victory. Nebraska had been very strong in the turnover margin department in the first half of the season, but a -4 turnover difference at Indiana played a big part in the result.

Ohio State will come into Saturday's game with a 5-1 overall record and a 2-1 mark in Big Ten Conference play. The Buckeyes are ranked No. 4 in both the Associated Press Poll and coaches poll heading into the second half of their season. Ohio State was off last week following a one-point loss at third-ranked Oregon on Oct. 12.

Coach Ryan Day's team features one of the nation's most potent offenses, as the Buckeyes average 43.5 points and 503.0 total yards per game to rank among the top 10 nationally in both categories. Ohio State's defense is also among the nation's best, allowing 11.0 points and 254.3 yards per game to lead the Big Ten and rank in the top five nationally in both categories.

# THIS WEEK'S NUMBERS

Nebraska is facing its second straight ranked opponent in No. 4 Ohio State. It marks the first time Nebraska has played back-to-back ranked opponents since late in the 2021 season (Ohio State, at Wisconsin). It is the first time NU has had consecutive road games against ranked teams since early in the 2021 season (at Oklahoma, at Michigan State).

Nebraska senior rover Isaac Gifford increased his career tackle total to 207 with eight tackles at Indiana. Gifford is one of just 10 defensive backs and 43 players overall in school history to top 200 career tackles.

# SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKAVS. OHIO STATE

Nebraska and Ohio State will meet for the 11th time overall on Saturday, and the first time since 2021. The Buckeyes own a 9-1 advantage in the series, including winning the past seven meetings.

- Nebraska and Ohio State met for six straight seasons between 2016 and 2021 with the Buckeyes ranked in the top 10 in each of those matchups.
- At least one of the teams has been ranked in all 11 matchups, including this week's game. In 10 of the 11 matchups Nebraska has faced an Ohio State team ranked 12th or higher in the AP poll, including nine Buckeye teams ranked in the top 10.
- Nebraska was ranked in three straight matchups between 2011 and 2016, including 2011 when the No. 14 Huskers picked up their lone win in the series, a 34-27 comeback victory in Lincoln. The Huskers rallied from a 21-point third-quarter deficit in that game to mark the largest comeback in school history.

# **HUSKERS FACE ANOTHER RANKED ROAD TEST**

Saturday's game against the fourth-ranked Buckeyes marks Nebraska second straight game against a ranked foe.

- The matchup in Columbus will be Nebraska's third overall game against a ranked opponent this season, including matchups with No. 24 Ilinois and at No. 16 Indiana.
- With Ohio State ranked No. 4 this week, Saturday's game will mark the sixth straight season Nebraska has faced a top-five opponent.

# **HUSKERS POST BEST FIRST HALF OF SEASON SINCE 2016**

Nebraska opened the season with three consecutive non-conference victories, marking its first 3-0 start to the season since 2016. It was also the first time Nebraska was unblemished in non-conference play since 2016. The Huskers' 5-1 mark at the midpoint of the season was also NU's best six-game record since 2016, when Nebraska began the season with seven wins.

- The 5-2 start through seven games marks only the second time in the past 10 seasons Nebraska has had five or more wins through seven games.
- The Huskers' 5-1 first half of the season marked the 10th time since 2000 Nebraska has been 5-1 or better through six games.
- Nebraska was ranked in both national polls for two consecutive weeks (Sept. 8, Sept. 15). Nebraska rose as high as 22nd in both polls. The No. 22 AP ranking was Nebraska's highest since being ranked 17th entering the 2016 regular-season finale at Iowa.
- The Sept. 20 game with Illinois was the first matchup of two AP ranked teams at Memorial Stadium since 2013 (vs. UCLA) and the first Big Ten games between two ranked teams since 2011 when 13th-ranked Nebraska defeated No. 9 Michigan State.

# **NEBRASKA SHOWS ABILITY TO CONTROL GAMES**

In posting its best start to a season since 2016, Nebraska has shown the ability to control games in the first half of the season. The Huskers did not trail in their first three games, and out-scored the opposition by a total of 102-20 in non-conference play. Nebraska trailed for less than 16 minutes of game action prior to last Saturday's loss at Indiana.

- Nebraska won each of its first three games by at least 18 points. It marked the first time NU won three straight games by at least 18 points since the middle of the 2014 season, when the Huskers defeated Northwestern (21), Rutgers (18) and Purdue (21). The Huskers added a fourth win by at least 18 points with its 28-10 win at Purdue.
- Nebraska's early-season success was largely a result of fast starts. Nebraska out-scored its first six
  opponents in the second quarter by a total of 65-3, before Indiana had a 21-7 edge in the second
  quarter last week. In 2023, Nebraska was out-scored 81-66 in the second quarter. Nebraska has
  pitched three first-half shutouts through seven games (Colorado, Purdue, Rutgers).
- Dating back to 2023, Nebraska has allowed just three first-quarter touchdowns in its past 14 games. Indiana was just the third opponent in the past 20 games to score a touchdown on its opening drive.

# NOTING LAST GAME

- Tight end **Thomas Fidone II** set career highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (91), bettering his previous highs of four catches and 46 receiving yards.
- True freshman receiver **Jacory Barney Jr.** had a career-high eight receptions. He also had his third rushing touchdown of the season.
- Linebacker Mikai Gbayor set a career high with two tackles for loss, including a nineyard sack.
- Senior rover **Isaac Gifford** had eight tackles to push his career total to 207 tackles. He is the 10th defensive back in school history to top 200 tackles.
- Indiana totaled 495 yards to end a Husker streak of 13 straight games holding the opponent to 400 or fewer yards. The Hoosiers were also the first team to score a rushing touchdown against the Huskers this season.

# **BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE STRONG AGAIN IN 2024**

The Nebraska defense was one of the nation's most improved units in 2023. The Blackshirts have been strong again in 2024, ranking among the Big Ten leaders in several categories.

- Nebraska allowed just 20 combined points in its first three games, the fewest through three games since NU allowed 16 points in the first three games in 2005. Nebraska is allowing 17.7 points per game to rank 19th nationally.
- Nebraska has held five opponents to 10 or fewer points this season. The five opponents held to 10 or fewer points is already the most by Nebraska in a season since the 2009 Blackshirts held eight of 14 opponents to 10 or fewer points.
- With an overtime touchdown, Illinois ended a streak of 10 straight opponents Nebraska had held to 24 or fewer points. It was the longest stretch Nebraska had limited the opposition to 24 points or less since a 14-game stretch spanning the 2009 and 2010 seasons.
- Nebraska's defense has been very dominant at home. Since the start of the 2023 season, just two of 12 opponents at Memorial Stadium have scored more than 14 points.
- Before last week's game at Indiana, Nebraska had held 13 straight opponents to less than 400 total yards dating back to last season. The last time Nebraska held more than 13 straight opponents to less than 400 yards was part of a 14-game stretch spanning the final three games of 2008 and first 11 contests of 2009. Nebraska has held four opponents to less than 300 yards.
- Nebraska is allowing 304.3 yards of total offense per game which ranks 18th nationally.
- The Husker defense has allowed 19 plays of 20+ yards through seven games (5 rush, 14 pass), which is the ninth-fewest in the country.

# SHUTTING DOWN THE RUN

Nebraska's defense has been strong against the run over the past two seasons. Indiana was the first team to score a rushing touchdown against Nebraska this season. The Huskers rank 16th nationally in rushing defense at 102.7 yards per game.

- Nebraska held its first six opponents without a rushing touchdown, tying for the longest seasonopening streak in FBS without allowing a rushing touchdown in the past 10 seasons. Prior to this year, the last team to not allow a rushing touchdown through its first six games was Georgia in 2019. The last Big Ten team to not allow a rushing touchdown in its first six games was lowa in 2013.
- Dating back to last season, the Huskers have not allowed a rushing touchdown in 11 of their past 14 games.
- Nebraska held Colorado to just 16 rushing yards, the fewest rushing yards by an opponent since Purdue had -2 rushing yards in 2020. Nebraska has also held UTEP (56), Purdue (5) and Rutgers (78) to less than 80 rushing yards. In 19 games under Head Coach Matt Rhule, the Huskers have held the opponent to less than 100 rushing yards 12 times, including eight games with 75 yards or less.
- Nebraska has allowed just two individual 100-yard rushers in 19 games over the past two seasons.
- The rush defense is assisted by Nebraska's strong sack numbers. The Huskers have 21 sacks, which is 13th nationally. The Huskers have three games with four or more sacks. Nebraska had 32 sacks in 2023 which marked the most sacks by Nebraska since recording 39 in 2013.

# WINNING THE TURNOVER MARGIN

Nebraska's 5-1 start was fueled in part by a +6 turnover differential through the first half of the season, with Nebraska owning a positive or even TO margin in each of the first six games. At Indiana, Nebraska was a -4 in turnover margin. The Huskers remain at +2 in turnover margin after finishing last season at -17 in turnover margin.

- Nebraska's defense has posted multiple takeaways four times in 2024 (UTEP, Colorado, Illinois, Rutgers), and single takeaways against UNI, Purdue and Indiana.
- The Huskers have a takeaway in all seven games, Nebraska's longest streak since a nine-game stretch spanning the 2021 (final game) and 2022 (first eight games) seasons.
- The multiple takeaways in consecutive games (UTEP, Colorado) marked the first time the Husker defense accomplished that since 2020 when Nebraska had multiple takeaways against Northwestern and Penn State.
- Nebraska has had a positive turnover margin five times in 2024. The Huskers were positive in turnover margin in their first three Big Ten games, marking the first time Nebraska has had a positive turnover margin in three straight games since late in the 2018 season.
- The Huskers did not allow the opposition to score a point off turnovers through the first six games. However, Indiana scored 28 points off Husker turnovers in the loss in Bloomington. Nebraska has outscored opponents 38-28 in points off turnovers this season, including a pair of interception returns for touchdowns.

# **DEFENSE PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD**

Nebraska's 38 points off turnovers include the defense doing some of its own work in that category. In the season opener against UTEP, NU recorded a safety and followed up with a pick-six by **Tommi Hill** against Colorado. **John Bullock** added an interception for a touchdown at Purdue.

- The interception for a touchdown by Hill against the Buffs was Nebraska's first pick-six since Cam Taylor-Britt had a 38-yard interception for a touchdown against Iowa in 2019. It was Nebraska's first defensive touchdown of any kind since Deontai Williams returned a fumble for a score against Penn State in 2020.
- With Nebraska adding a second pick-six at Purdue it marks the first time Nebraska has had a pair of interception returns for touchdowns in the same season since 2019.
- In the 40-7 win over UTEP in the opener, defensive lineman **Ty Robinson** had a tackle for loss for a safety. It was Nebraska's first defensive safety since 2015.
- With scores in back-to-back games to open the year, it marked the first time the defense scored in consecutive games since 2015, when Joshua Kalu had an interception return for a touchdown at Minnesota, and a week later the Huskers had a safety against Northwestern in Lincoln.

# **ROBINSON ANCHORS POWERFUL DEFENSIVE FRONT**

The Nebraska defense is full of veteran performers who have been fixtures for the Husker defense for multiple seasons. That veteran group is headlined by sixth-year senior defensive lineman **Ty Robinson**. Robinson has played in 54 career games at Nebraska with 40 career starts, and he is just two games from tying the Nebraska school record.

- Robinson has paced the Nebraska defense in disruptive plays in 2024. The Gilbert, Ariz., native
  has 16 tackles, including six tackles for loss and four sacks. His six TFL leads the Huskers and his
  four sacks are tied for the team lead. He has added three PBU and a blocked field goal.
- Robinson's first TFL this season resulted in a safety against UTEP, and he also recorded a sack in the win over the Miners.
- The Nebraska defense and Robinson set the tone early against Colorado. On a CU three-and-out to start the game, Robinson had a PBU on the game's opening snap, and a nine-yard sack two plays later to set the tone. Robinson added a blocked field goal in the second quarter against the Buffs, as NU held Colorado scoreless in the first half.
- Robinson has recorded at least one sack and one TFL in four of seven games this season.

# **NEBRASKA SHOWS ABILITY TO START STRONG**

The Nebraska offense has flashed its explosiveness throughout the season, and through the first half of the year was particularly strong before halftime.

- Nebraska's 40 points against UTEP were its most since scoring 42 against Georgia Southern in 2022, while the 33-point margin of victory was Nebraska's largest since a 56-7 victory over Northwestern in 2021. It was the Huskers' largest margin of victory in a season opener since a 43-10 win over Fresno State to open the 2016 season.
- Nebraska scored at least 24 points in its first five games, the first time NU has had five straight games with 24 or more points since a five-game streak spanning the 2018 and 2019 seasons. It was the first time the Huskers have scored at least 24 points in their first five games since 2016.
- Nebraska has scored more than 14 points in the first half in five of seven games, and has outscored opponents 117-48 in the first half. Nebraska's 30 points in the first half against UTEP were its most in a first half since scoring 35 in the first half against Northwestern in 2021.
- Nebraska did flip the script at Purdue with 28 second-half points after being held scoreless in the first half. The 28 second-half points were Nebraska's most since scoring 31 against North Dakota in the second half of a 2022 win.

- The Huskers gained 507 yards of total offense against UTEP, the most by Nebraska since gaining 575 yards against Georgia Southern in 2022. The Huskers reached 339 yards before halftime, which was just 80 yards shy of last year's season high for total offense for a full game (419 vs. Louisiana Tech).
- Nebraska's 284 passing yards against UTEP were its most since throwing for 354 yards at Purdue in 2022. Nebraska's season high in passing yards in 2023 was 199 vs. Michigan. Nebraska has added passing outputs of 281 yards vs. UNI, 297 yards against Illinois and 257 yards at Purdue. The Huskers average 243.1 yards per game through the air.
- Nebraska added 223 rushing yards against UTEP with 11 players having at least one carry. The win over UTEP marked the first time Nebraska topped 200 yards in both rushing and passing since 2022 against Georgia Southern.
- The first half of the season has showcased Nebraska's many offensive weapons. Sixteen players have carried the ball, while 16 Huskers have caught a pass. In the opener, Nebraska had 11 ball carriers and 11 receivers, the most in both categories in a single game since 2021.

# **RAIOLA GUIDING HUSKER OFFENSE**

True freshman quarterback **Dylan Raiola** has been impressive in leading Nebraska to a 5-2 start. Raiola has thrown for better than 200 yards five times, including a career-high 297 yards and three touchdowns against Illinois. Overall, Raiola has thrown for 1,592 yards and nine touchdowns. His passing yardage leads FBS true freshmen and he is one of only three freshmen (true or redshirt) with more than 1,500 passing yards.

- Raiola is on pace to break the Nebraska freshman single-season passing yardage record, held by Adrian Martinez who threw for 2,617 yards in 2018 as a true freshman, which is the only 2,000-yard passing season by a Husker freshman.
- Raiola has completed 66.2 percent of his passes to rank 29th nationally and third among freshmen. He connected on at least 70 percent in each of the first three games. He was the first Husker quarterback to complete at least 70 percent of his passes in three straight games since Jeff Quinn in 1980.
- On a national level, Raiola was the first true freshman since Marcus Mariota (2012, Oregon) to complete at least 70 percent of his passes in each of his first three games.
- Raiola's three touchdown passes against Illinois marked the first time a Nebraska quarterback had three touchdown passes since Casey Thompson at Iowa in 2022.
- In the season opener against UTEP, Raiola completed 19-of-27 passes for 238 yards and two touchdowns, while playing just one series after halftime. Raiola became just the second true freshman Husker quarterback since World War II to start a season opener, joining Adrian Martinez in 2018. Raiola earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors for his play in the opener.
- Raiola was the first Husker freshman (redshirt or true) quarterback to win his first start since Taylor Martinez guided Nebraska to a victory over Western Kentucky in the 2010 season opener. Martinez won his first five starts of the 2010 season.
- The 232 yards of total offense by Raiola against UTEP compared favorably to the starting debuts of other Husker freshman quarterbacks over the past three decades.

# **RAIOLA, BARNEY JR. EARN NATIONAL RECOGNITION**

Raiola's play through the first half of the season was recognized on a national level last week when he was named to the On3 Midseason True Freshman All-America team. Raiola was joined on the team by receiver **Jacory Barney Jr.**, who was selected as an all-purpose player.

- Barney has made his impact felt as a receiver, runner and return threat. A Miami native, Barney leads the team with 27 receptions, totaling 181 yards. He has rushed eight times for 111 yards and three touchdowns, averaging an impressive 13.9 yards per rush. Barney is also Nebraska's top kickoff returner and has nine returns for 164 yards in 2024. Barney had a career-best eight catches at Indiana, while adding a touchdown run.
- Nebraska was one of six schools with a pair of players on the midseason frosh All-America team, joining Alabama, Texas, Miami, Notre Dame and South Carolina. Nebraska was the only team with two offensive players on the squad.

# **VETERAN RECEIVERS MAKING QUICK IMPACT**

Nebraska added a pair of veteran receivers through the transfer portal in the offseason. **Jahmal Banks** joined the Huskers from Wake Forest, while **Isaiah Neyor** came to Nebraska after previously playing at Texas and Wyoming. The two seniors each check in at 6-4 and 220 pounds, and have shown an immediate connection with quarterback Dylan Raiola.

- The duo has combined for 42 receptions for 620 yards and six touchdowns. Neyor has 19 catches for 304 yards and four touchdowns, while Banks has 23 catches for 316 yards and two touchdowns.
- Neyor posted his fourth career 100-yard receiving game and first since 2021 with six receptions for 121 yards and a 59-yard touchdown against UTEP. Neyor's six catches matched his career high and his 121 yards were just five yards shy of a career high. He added four catches for 31 yards against Colorado, had a TD catch against UNI, and a pair of touchdowns against Illinois.
- Banks also made his mark in the opener against UTEP with four catches for 61 yards, including a 21-yard touchdown catch just two seconds before halftime. He tied his career high with eight receptions for 94 yards against Illinois, then led Nebraska with five catches for 82 yards and a touchdown at Purdue.
- Both players have had productive careers before joining the Huskers. Banks now has 130 career catches for 1,720 yards and 15 career touchdowns. Neyor has 72 catches for 1,444 yards and 16 touchdowns in his career. Neyor averages an impressive 20.1 yards per catch in his career.

# **HUSKERS POSSESS VETERAN OFFENSIVE LINE**

The most experienced unit on the Nebraska team entering 2024 was the offensive line. Husker offensive linemen combined to play in 224 career games with 153 career starts entering this season.

- According to research compiled by West Virginia's Mike Montoro, Nebraska's 189 combined offensive line starts ranks as the fifth most in the country.
- Bryce Benhart, a member of the Outland Trophy watch list, leads the way with 48 career starts, starting 48 of Nebraska's 51 games at right tackle the past four seasons. Benhart's 48 career starts are the most starts by an offensive lineman in program history, and he is four starts from the school record for a position player. Benhart has played in 54 career games, two from the Nebraska school record.
- **Turner Corcoran** has started 35 games for the Huskers with 30 starts at left tackle, three starts at left guard and two starts at right tackle. Corcoran had started 30 consecutive games before suffering a season-ending injury against Northwestern last season. He was injured early in the Illinois game on Sept. 20 and has missed Nebraska's past three games.
- Ben Scott is in his second season as Nebraska's starting center. A member of the Rimington Trophy watch list, Scott started 11 games for the Huskers last season and all seven games this season. He has made 46 career starts including his three seasons at Arizona State.
- Transfer **Micah Mazzccua** joined the Huskers this season and has started 24 games in his career, including 11 starts at right guard for Florida in 2023, 10 starts at Baylor in 2022, and three games for the Huskers this season.
- Justin Evans (12 starts), Henry Lutovsky (9 starts), Gunnar Gottula (3 starts) and Joey Mancino (1 start) have also started at least one game on the Nebraska offensive line. Evans has been in the starting lineup for all seven games this season, with Lutovsky starting the past five contests. Gottula has filled in for the injured Corcoran and started the past three games.
- Teddy Prochazka has started 11 games for Nebraska, but he will miss the 2024 campaign after suffering an injury during fall camp. The injury marked the third time in four seasons that Prochazka has suffered a season-ending injury.

# TRANSFERS ADD EXPERIENCE TO NEBRASKA ROSTER

Nebraska added 60 newcomers to its roster in 2024. That number includes a large freshman class of 48, but adding experience to the roster are 12 first-year transfers, including six FBS transfers.

- The group of six FBS transfers all came from Power Conference programs. The six players have combined for 198 games played and 101 starts in their careers.
- Stefon Thompson played in 38 games with 21 starts at linebacker for Syracuse. He entered the 2024 season with 169 career tackles, 20.0 tackles for loss and 10.5 sacks. Thompson owns the most tackles, TFLs and sacks of any Husker on the 2024 roster. He made his first career start at Nebraska against UNI and had six tackles and added five against Illinois.
- Micah Mazzccua started 21 games on the offensive lines at Baylor and Florida. In 2022 at Baylor, PFF ranked Mazzccua as the best run-blocker in the Big 12 and the nation's 15th-best run blocker.
- Ceyair Wright made 15 starts at cornerback for USC in 2022 and 2023, and started this season against Rutgers and Purdue. He totaled 41 tackles as a Trojan with 1.0 tackle for loss, one interception and five pass breakups. Wright has responded to his increased role the past four weeks with six tackles, his first career sack and a fumble caused against Illinois. He added a team-high five tackles and two PBU at Purdue, and had his first Nebraska interception, four tackles and two breakups against Rutgers. He added six tackles and a PBU at Indiana.

- Isaiah Neyor has started 18 games in his career. He was a second-team All-Mountain West Conference selection in 2021 at Wyoming before spending two seasons at Texas. Neyor is second to fellow first-year transfer Jahmal Banks in career receptions, yards and touchdowns among Huskers.
- Jahmal Banks played in 43 games with 11 starts at Wake Forest before transferring to Nebraska. Banks totaled 107 receptions for 1,404 yards and 13 touchdowns as a Demon Deacon. He owns the most career receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns of any current Husker.
- Dante Dowdell spent one season at Oregon before transferring to Nebraska. Dowdell had 17 carries for 90 yards and one touchdown in 2023 for a Duck team that ranked second nationally in total offense and scoring offense. Dowdell leads Nebraska with 350 rushing yards and five touchdowns, including a career-high 74 yards against Colorado and 72 yards against Illinois.

# **NEBRASKA CELEBRATES 400TH CONSECUTIVE SELLOUT**

Nebraska celebrated its 400th consecutive sellout at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 20 against Illinois. The Huskers have sold out every game at Memorial Stadium for more than six decades, beginning with a game against Missouri on Nov. 3, 1962. Nebraska added sellout No. 401 against Rutgers (Oct. 5) and has sold out its final two home games of the 2024 season–Nov. 2 vs. UCLA and Nov. 23 vs. Wisconsin, which will stretch the sellout streak to 403 games by season's end.

- During the sellout streak, Memorial Stadium has expanded several times and capacity has grown from 31,080 in 1962 to the current capacity of 82,841. Over 31 million fans have watched the Huskers at Memorial Stadium during the streak.
- Nebraska has a record of 325-76 during the sellout streak. The game against No. 24 Illinois was the 87th matchup against a ranked opponent during the sellout streak, with Nebraska owning a 47-40 mark in those games.

# NINE HUSKERS EARN SPOTS ON PRESEASON WATCH LISTS

Nine Nebraska Cornhuskers made a preseason watch list for a major national award this summer.

- True freshman Jacory Barney Jr. was named to the watch list for The Jet Award, presented to the nation's top returner. The award is named after Husker Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers.
- Bryce Benhart was one of 75 linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. Benhart was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection as Nebraska's starting right tackle in 2023. The Outland Trophy is presented annually to the nation's best interior lineman.
- Brian Buschini, the 2021 FCS Punter of the Year, was one of 33 punters named to the preseason watch list for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to the nation's best punter.
- Thomas Fidone II was one of 48 tight ends named to the preseason watch list for the John Mackey Award, presented annually to the nation's best tight end. Fidone led Nebraska with four touchdown catches in 2024, the most by a Husker tight end since 2010.
- Isaac Gifford was honored for his work on the field and in the community with an appointment to the Allstate Wuerffel Trophy Watch List. Gifford led Nebraska with 86 tackles while earning honorable-mention All-Big Ten accolades. Off the field, he earned a Sam Foltz 27 Hero Leadership Award in 2024 and was named to both the Brook Berringer and Tom Osborne Citizenship teams. In September, Gifford was named a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy and was placed on the watch list for the Jason Witten College Man of the Yar.
- Nash Hutmacher was one of 90 players and 37 defensive linemen named to the preseason watch list for the Chuck Bednarik Award, presented annually to the outstanding defensive player in college football. Hutmacher was an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection last season.
- Dylan Raiola was named to the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year watch list and the Shaun Alexander Award Watch list.
- Isaiah Neyor was one of 93 players named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award watch list. The award is presented to the top offensive player who played high school or college football in Texas.
- Ben Scott, an honorable-mention All-Big Ten selection in 2023, was one of 40 centers named to the Rimington Trophy watch list. The Rimington Trophy named after former Husker center Dave Rimington is presented annually to the nation's top center.

# NINE HUSKERS NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL WATCH LIST

A total of nine Huskers made the preseason watch list for the Reese's Senior Bowl. The Reese's Senior Bowl is widely regarded as the preeminent college football all-star game and the first stage in the NFL Draft process. The 2025 game will be played on Feb. 1 in Mobile, Ala.

- Five offensive players made the Senior Bowl watch list: wide receivers Jahmal Banks and Isaiah Neyor, tight end Thomas Fidone II and offensive linemen Micah Mazzccua and Ben Scott.
- Four defenders also made the Senior Bowl watch list: defensive linemen Nash Hutmacher and Ty Robinson and defensive backs Tommi Hill and DeShon Singleton.

# SINGLE-DIGIT NUMBERS AWARDED TO 'TOUGHEST' HUSKERS

For the second straight season, single-digit jersey numbers were awarded to the team's "toughest" players. The single-digit honorees were chosen through a players-only vote and the players then got to choose which single-digit number they wanted.

• The tradition of single-digit numbers being reserved for the chosen few dates back to Rhule's time at Temple.

"I got really tired of having a guy in my program who had spent three years at like No. 47... wanted to wear No. 1 or No. 3, and he had earned it and we would give it to a recruit," Rhule said prior to the 2023 season. "What we decided was (numbers) 1-9, now 0-9, would go to the nine or now 10 'toughest' guys on the team. When I say 'toughest', we define that for the guys, but really the guys who best exemplify what it means to be a Cornhusker. To be accountable, to be dependable, to be tough, hard-working, competitive every single day."

# **RHULE LOOKS FOR ANOTHER STRONG SECOND SEASON**

Nebraska went 5-7 in Matt Rhule's first season. The Huskers aim to increase their win total this season, something Rhule has done at each of his previous two collegiate head coaching stops. Through seven games in 2024, Nebraska has matched its 2023 win total.

- In his first head coaching job at Temple, Rhule helped the Owls to a four-win improvement from his first season to his second. Then at Baylor, Rhule guided the Bears to a six-win improvement from year one to year two. That improvement ranked third nationally and was the largest win improvement of any Power Conference program that season.
- Rhule took on rebuilding jobs at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, which contributed to an 8-28 combined record in his first season at each school. But excluding his first season at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska, Rhule boasts a 49-24 record with three 10-win seasons in six seasons.
- Rhule has a proven record as a program builder. He led both Temple and Baylor to the highest win totals in program history in his third season at each school.
- Rhule guided Temple to a pair of trips to the American Athletic Conference title game, the first two appearances in the league title game in school history. His 2016 Owl team won the school's first conference title in nearly 40 years.
- Rhule led Temple to back-to-back bowl appearances for the first time in school history in 2015 and 2016.
- At Baylor, Rhule became the first head coach at a Power Conference school to take a team from 11 losses (1-11 in 2017) to 11 victories (11-3 in 2019) in two or fewer seasons.
- The 2019 Baylor team set a school record for wins with 11 and the Bears' 9-0 start was the best in school history.

# **MAJORITY OF STAFF RETURNS & RULE CHANGE BOLSTERS STAFF**

The Huskers returned eight of their 10 full-time assistants from last season, welcoming two new full-time assistants to the coaching staff. In addition to the two new assistants, an NCAA rule change has permitted additional staff members to provide on-field coaching.

- **Donovan Raiola** is in his third season at Nebraska in 2024 after being the lone assistant coach retained by Matt Rhule following the 2022 season.
- Other returning coaches on the offensive staff include offensive coordinator Marcus Satterfield (second season), running backs coach E.J. Barthel (second season) and wide receivers coach Garret McGuire (second season). The four returning offensive assistants helped the Huskers rank second in the Big Ten in rushing last season.
- **Glenn Thomas** is the lone new addition to the offensive staff, serving as Nebraska's quarterbacks coach and co-offensive coordinator. He came to Lincoln after one season as an offensive assistant with the Pittsburgh Steelers, helping the Steelers to a berth in the AFC playoffs in 2023.
- Thomas spent five seasons on Matt Rhule's coaching staffs at Temple and Baylor, serving as the offensive coordinator for the Owls in 2016 and as the co-offensive coordinator at Baylor from 2017 to 2019. Thomas also has recent experience as a quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at Arizona State (2022) and UNLV (2020-21).
- On defense, coordinator Tony White (second season) returns as does linebackers coach Rob Dvoracek (second season) and defensive line coach Terrance Knighton (second season). Last year, that trio helped Nebraska post its best scoring defense, total defense and rushing defense since the Huskers joined the Big Ten in 2011.
- John Butler is the only new defensive assistant, serving as the Huskers' secondary coach and pass game coordinator. Butler came to Nebraska after spending the previous six seasons as the defensive backs coach for the Buffalo Bills. Buffalo had a top-five pass defense rating in five of his six seasons, helping the Bills win four AFC North titles and make five playoff appearances.
- Special teams coordinator **Ed Foley** also returns for his second season in 2024. He helped Nebraska rank third nationally in blocked kicks in his first season last fall.
- With the removal of the NCAA rule limiting the number of on-field coaches, Matt Rhule has announced 10 more staff members who will provide additional on-field coaching this fall.

# **NOTES FROM NEBRASKA'S 2023 SEASON**

Nebraska entered 2024 with a goal of making significant progress in Matt Rhule's second season. Despite finishing 5-7 in 2023, Nebraska made strides in many areas. Four of the seven losses were by three points with a fifth loss by a touchdown in overtime. In Rhule's first season, Nebraska's accomplishments included:

- Nebraska had the program's fewest penalty yards per game (42.8) since 1998.
- The Huskers ranked among the nation's 15 most-improved teams in rushing offense, rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense. NU had the nation's No. 2 most-improved rush defense, the No. 3 most-improved total defense and the No. 10 most-improved scoring defense. Offensively, the Huskers had the 14th most-improved rushing attack from 2022 to 2023.
- Nebraska posted its best statistical rushing defense, total defense and scoring defense since joining the Big Ten in 2011. The Huskers allowed their fewest points per game (18.3) since 2010, their fewest yards per game (303.5) since 2009 and their fewest rushing yards per game (92.9) since 1999.
- NU ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense, 11th nationally in total defense and 13th nationally in scoring defense in 2023. The Huskers posted their highest national ranking in rushing defense since 1999 and best national ranking in total and scoring defense since 2010.
- Nebraska held eight opponents to 14 or fewer points in 2023, a first for the program since the 2009 season, when the Huskers led the nation in scoring defense.
- The Huskers held six of their 12 opponents in 2023 to fewer than 300 total yards, while also limiting eight of 12 opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards.
- Nebraska totaled its most sacks (32) since 2013 and most tackles for loss (76) since 2016.
- Offensively, the Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten in rushing in 2023 (176.8 ypg).
- Nebraska also had one of the best big-play offenses in the Big Ten. The Huskers ranked second in the Big Ten with eight plays of 50 yards or longer in 2023 while leading the league in rushes of 40 yards or longer, 60 yards or longer and 70 yards or longer.
- From a special teams standpoint, Nebraska ranked third nationally with four blocked kicks in 2023. The Huskers recorded their most blocked kicks since 2014.

# **NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS**

Nebraska is playing its 135th football season this fall, and the Huskers have historically been one of the top programs in college football history.

- Nebraska ranks eighth in NCAA history with 922 wins and 53 all-time bowl game appearances.
- The Huskers have won five national titles. Nebraska's four Associated Press national championships (1970, 1971, 1994, 1995) rank seventh all-time and NU's four coaches poll titles (1971, 1994, 1995, 1997) rank fourth.
- Nebraska's 46 conference titles rank second in NCAA history.
- The success extends to the classroom as well. Nebraska football has produced more Academic All-Americans (108) and more NCAA Top 10 Award winners (9) than any other team in any sport in NCAA history.

# HOME OF THE HUSKERS



Memorial Stadium celebrated its 100th year in 2023. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

# 2024 NEBRASKA SEASON NOTEBOOK

# SCHEDULE NOTES

- Nebraska completed non-league play at 3-0 and is in the middle of a nine-game conference schedule. The Big Ten slate includes games against UCLA and USC, both in their first season as a Big Ten member. The 2024 season marks the first time since Nebraska joined the conference in 2011 that the Big Ten will not utilize a divisional format.
- NU plays Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Ohio State, Purdue, Rutgers, UCLA, USC and Wisconsin. The Huskers will not play Maryland, Michigan, Michigan State, Minnesota, Northwestern, Oregon, Penn State or Washington.
- Nebraska opened the 2024 season at home against UTEP, marking the first season since 2019 that Nebraska played its first game of the season at home. It was also the first time since 2019 that the Huskers opened the season against a non-conference opponent.
- Nebraska played its first four games at home, marking the longest season-opening homestand since 2013 (five games).
- The Huskers played three straight September night games. This is only the third time in program history (2002, 2008) that NU had three straight night home games.
- The Big Ten opener against Illinois was the 400th sellout at Memorial Stadium. It also marked the first Friday night home game in school history while being the first weekday home game (excluding Black Friday) since 2001, when Nebraska played Rice on Thursday, Sept. 20, in a game postponed five days due to the Sept. 11 attacks.
- The Huskers played their opener in August for the fourth straight year and the fifth time in the past five full seasons (2020 excluded).

# **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

- Matt Rhule is in his second season at Nebraska in 2024. Rhule is in his 12th season as a head coach after previously leading programs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19) along with an NFL stint as head coach of the Carolina Panthers (2020-22).
- Rhule owns a career record of 57-52 in his eight seasons as a college head coach. He has a proven record as a program builder after taking on rebuilding projects at Temple, Baylor and Nebraska.
- Rhule's college teams have taken a step forward in his second season at each school. Temple improved by four wins in Rhule's second season in 2014 and Baylor improved by six wins in his second season in 2018, an improvement that led all power conference teams and ranked third in the FBS.
- Rhule then guided both the Owls and Bears to a school-record win total in his third season, when both teams also played in the conference championship game.
- Eight Husker assistants return from last season: Marcus Satterfield (offensive coordinator/tight ends), Tony White (defensive coordinator), Ed Foley (special teams coordinator), E.J. Barthel

(running backs), Rob Dvoracek (linebackers), Terrance Knighton (defensive line), Garret McGuire (wide receivers) and Donovan Raiola (offensive line).

• John Butler (secondary/pass game coordinator) and Glenn Thomas (co-offensive coordinator/ quarterbacks) are in their first season at NU.

- The roster features 91 returning players and 61 newcomers. Nebraska returns a total of 20 starters and 39 letterwinners.
- NU added 13 transfers and 48 true freshmen to its roster in 2024. Among the 13 transfers are seven FBS transfers, three JUCO players, two FCS transfers and one NAIA transfer.
- All six of Nebraska's FBS transfers came from Power Conference programs (Florida, Oregon, Syracuse, Texas, USC and Wake Forest).
- The roster features players from 29 states and one foreign country (Germany).
- Nebraska has had a letterwinner from 47 of the 50 states in its history, missing only Idaho, New Hampshire and Rhode Island.
- States with multiple players on the Huskers' 2024 roster include: Nebraska (53), Texas (12), Iowa (8), Florida (7), Pennsylvania (7), California (6), New Jersey (5), Arizona (4), Colorado (4), Georgia (4), Missouri (4) Illinois (3), Louisiana (3), Maryland (3), Minnesota (3), New York (3), Tennessee (3), Hawaii (2), Kansas (2), Michigan (2), Mississippi (2), Montana (2) and South Dakota (2).
- The states of Alabama, North Carolina, Nevada, Utah, Washington and Wisconsin are each represented with one player on Nebraska's 2024 roster.
- The players who are wearing a single-digit jersey number (0-9) earned the right to wear that number through a team vote.

Ryan Day is in his seventh season at the helm of Ohio State and his ninth year with the Buckeyes. He boasts a career record of 61-9.

Day has won two Big Ten Championships as a head coach and has made it to the College Football Playoff in 2019, 2020 and 2022. Day led the Buckeyes to the CFP final in 2020, where Ohio State fell to the No. 1 Alabama Crimson Tide, 52-24. The Buckeyes fell 29-23 to Clemson in the CFP semifinal in 2019 and dropped a 42-41 heartbreaker to Georgia in the 2022 CFP semifinal.

Prior to being named head coach, Day served as Ohio State's offensive coordinator and quarterback coach for the 2017 and 2018 years. During this time, the Buckeyes went 25-3 and won two Big Ten Championships.

Day served stints at New Hampshire, Boston College, Florida, Temple, the Philadelphia Eagles and the San Francisco 49ers as a tight ends coach, wide receivers coach, quarterback coach and offensive coordinator.

# DAY VS. NEBRASKA

Day faces Nebraska for the fourth time as a head coach on Saturday. Day holds a 3-0 record against the Huskers after the Buckeyes won 26-17 in Lincoln in 2021.

# **OHIO STATE INFORMATION**

Ohio State has been one of the winningest programs in the country, and began their storied football tradition in 1890. A founding member of the Big Ten Conference (originally the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives), Ohio State has totaled 39 league championships. # A DE SEASON AT NEBRASKA <l

Matt Rhule has a proven track record as a program builder. In his first two collegiate head coaching jobs at Temple (2013-16) and Baylor (2017-19), Rhule led both the Owls and the Bears to their most victories in school history in just his third season. He also took both teams to the conference championship game in year three.

Rhule took Temple from two wins in his first season to a school-record 10 victories in both his third and fourth seasons with an appearance in the conference championship game both seasons. He then took Baylor from one win in his first season to a school-record 11 victories in his third season and an appearence in the Big 12 Championship Game and the Sugar Bowl.

Before taking the Nebraska job, Rhule one won conference title, three division titles and produced three seasons with double-digit wins in a five-season span (2015-19).

# TAKING TEMPLE TO NEW HEIGHTS

In his tenure at Temple from 2013 to 2016, Rhule took the Owls to new heights.

- In Rhule's second season in 2014, Temple posted the program's first win over an SEC team since 1938, its first win over a ranked opponent in 16 seasons and the program's largest margin of victory in nearly 50 years.
- Rhule won 10 games in both 2015 and 2016. He is responsible for two of the three 10-win seasons in Temple's 124-year history.
- He also took the Owls to back-to-back bowl games in 2015 and 2016, the first time Temple played in a bowl in consecutive seasons.
- In 2015, Rhule led Temple to the American Athletic Conference Championship Game, the first conference title game in program history.
- The next season, Rhule guided the Owls to their second conference title in program history and the first in nearly 40 years.
- Temple has spent a total of 16 weeks ranked in the 88-year history of the Associated Press top-25 poll. More than half of those top-25 rankings (9) came under Rhule in 2015 and 2016.

# **AN ENCORE AT BAYLOR**

At Temple, Rhule led the Owls to their highest season win total in program history, their first conference championship game appearance and an impressive run in the national rankings. He produced an encore by repeating each of those same feats in three seasons at Baylor.

- Baylor finished with 11 losses in Rhule's first season in 2017 but two years later, he guided the Bears to 11 wins in 2019. Baylor became the first Power Conference program to go from 11 losses to 11 wins in two or fewer seasons.
- Baylor won its final two games of the 2018 season and its first nine games of the 2019 campaign. The 11 straight victories marked the second-longest winning streak in school history, while Baylor's 9-0 start in 2019 was the best start in program history.
- In 2019, Rhule led Baylor to its most wins (11) in school history, the Bears advanced to their first Big 12 Championship Game and played in the Sugar Bowl for only the second time in program history.
- Baylor finished with a No. 13 ranking in 2019, the Bears' second-highest final ranking since 1951.


